Through this music competition scholarships will be awarded at the following levels: 1st place will be awarded \$1250, 2nd place will be awarded \$750, and 3rd place will be awarded \$500.

Eligibility:

Students wishing to apply for scholarship funds must meet the following criteria:

- Must be accepted to a college or university pursuing a degree in any area of music and have successfully completed any required auditions.
- Must demonstrate an exceptional past commitment to music.
- Must have at least a 3.0 grade point average
- Must be a senior at Fraser High School expecting to graduate at end of the school year in which he/she is applying.

Review Process:

All candidates must complete an application form and the audition process.

All candidates will be reviewed by a selection committee comprised of the professional staff of the Metropolitan Detroit Chorale, (music director, accompanist, and choreographer), as well as the Chorale's president, vice president, member-at-large, and an advisory board member or trustee.
